

We had a whopping 15 bus routes detoured throughout the storm, and all three Trolley lines experienced delays or flooded tracks requiring bus bridges to get our riders safely to their destinations.

Through it all, members of the MTS team remained upbeat and positive, distributing information to passengers and keeping riders dry when it was safe to do so.

She boarded the train at Euclid eastbound and when they arrived at Grossmont they were told that a shuttle bus would take them to ECTC. The supervisors and drivers were in good spirits and very informative. Said that she can't express enough how impressed she was and happy that she got home at about the same time that she normally would.
